John Servant’s new novel also emphasizes the power of steadfast friendship

MANAHAWKIN, N.J. – An award-winning newspaper man investigates the dramatic rise, fall and salvation of a once-powerful U.S. Senator who now lays in a hospital bed dying in John Servant’s new novel, “The Narrow Gate” ([published by WestBow Press](#)).

Taking place in New York and Washington, D.C., the book illustrates unbridled ambition’s ability to cause tragedy, and the hope and recovery that is possible for those who have suffered terrible loss due to their own mistakes.
